Mary Ann Herrmann, an 18-year-old Farmington Hills resident, received Michigan Metro Girl Scout Council's first Gold Award. The daughter of Thomas and Ann Herrmann was presented with the highest award in Girl Scouting by Irene Notohoff, her corporate sponsor.

Notohoff is a personnel administration representative with General Motors Acceptance Corp.; one of five Gold Award corporate sponsors from General Motors who have agreed to act as role models, introducing young women to the sponsor's career and work environment and sharing their specific experiences and skills with them.

The sponsors also purchase the Gold Award pin the Girl Scout awardee receives, and the miniature pin that the awarding parents receive as a symbol of pride in their daughter.
