

Laker alumni .500 in tourney

Laura Reed, a graduate of West Bloomfield High School, helped the University of Michigan women's softball team place third in the AIAW College World Series during the weekend in Norman, Okla.

Reed, who owned a 16-0 pitching record during her senior year of high school, was 1-1 at the national tournament. Reed was the winning pitcher against United States International, but the loser against Texas A&M.

Oklahoma State, which reached the finals via the winners' bracket, was slated to meet Texas A&M, which made it to the finals through the losers' bracket. However, Sunday's game was rained out. If the game were not played by Tuesday, Oklahoma State would be declared the winner since it was undefeated in tournament play.

The Wolverines defeated Rhode Island, 4-1, in the opener, before it nipped U.S. International, 2-1. The next two games went against Michigan as it lost to Oklahoma State, 2-1, and Texas A&M, 5-0.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS CITY COUNCIL MEETING MAY 24, 1982

Farmington Hills City Council held a regular meeting May 24, 1982. In the absence of Mayor Burwell, Councilman Wolf opened the meeting at 7:30 P.M. Members present were Dolan, Hughes, Sorensen, Williams and Wolf. Absent: Burwell and Lange. Others present were City Manager Savage, Assistant City Manager Condit, Deputy Clerk Reynolds, City Engineer Blazek and City Attorney Bibaux.

The agenda for the meeting was approved with the deletion of item 9.b. Appointments to Board and Commissions.

The minutes of May 19 and May 18, 1982 were approved.

Council postponed the Public Hearing of Zoning Map Amendment C62-268 (ZR 25-9-81) in Section 21 and set new date for June 21, 1982.

Presentations were made by eight liquor license applicants.

Council enacted Zoning Map Amendment C62-280 (ZR 2-2-82) to rezone 4.63 acres in Section 33 from RA-3 to RC-2.

Council enacted Zoning Map Amendment C62-281 (ZR 3-2-82) to rezone Lots 24, 35 and 36 of Farmington Heights Subdivision from OS-1 to P-1.

Council adopted Ordinance C-8-82 to amend Section 14.1120 of City Code to provide that rates and charges for the water system be established.

Council approved a request from RR & T Tavern Corporation to drop "Gene's Roadhouse" from the application for Class C license with Dance Permit located at 31205 Orchard Lake Road.

Council approved the settlement between Permanent Building Company v Ted Constantine and Farmington Hills.

The Prostitution Ordinance Section 80.230 of the City Code was referred back to the attorney for further study.

Council approved cooperative bidding and purchasing of gasoline and diesel fuel with other cities in Oakland County.

Council approved Agreement with Michigan Department of Transportation to improve the intersection of M-102 and Grand River.

Council approved Agreement with Michigan Department of Transportation for drainage facilities at the 149th right-of-way.

Council adopted Traffic Control Order establishing speed limit for a portion of Halsted Road between Eight and Nine Mile Road.

Meeting adjourned at 10:35 P.M.

The Southfield Blue Jays' softball team made it four in a row Monday with a 7-5 win over Berkley in the conclusion of a suspended contest.

The game began May 19, but was stopped due to inclement weather. At the time the game was halted, Southfield led, 6-1, in the third inning.

The win ended the Blue Jays' record to 7-7 in the Southeastern Michigan Association and 7-13 overall. Berkley fell to 4-10 in the SMA.

Linda Mitchell was the winning pitcher against Berkley, as she gave up seven hits, walked eight and fanned four.

Tammy Morgan led the offensive charge with three hits in three trips to the plate. Renee Guadagni knocked home two runs, and sophomore Janet Pedwaydon tripled in her first varsity at bat. She drove in a run with the hit, and later scored from third.

Friday, the Blue Jays play a pre-district contest at Farmington Our Lady of Mercy. If the Blue Jays prevail, they will participate in the Southfield District June 5.

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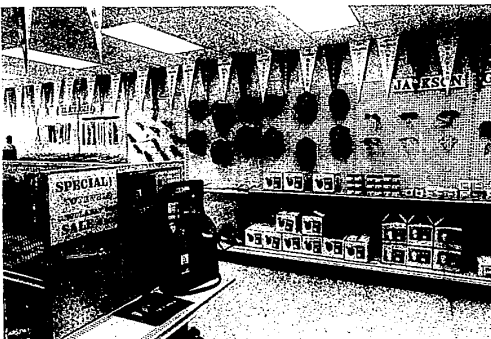
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
