

# 1870 Governor's Ball is history

for Governor buttons on his lapel. He walked with a gold-handled cane his grandfather owned.

"We should be cognizant of our heritage," Colburn said. "This is a great opportunity to participate in a reflection of our heritage of the city and village of Farmington."

Guests who arrived early were able to tour the decorated home escorted by Ellen Abdou, who will be the museum registrar when it opens to the public on a full-time basis. Items on loan to the museum include a bedroom set upstairs featuring an imposing Victorian bed with a headboard that almost reaches the ceiling. On the headboard is the head of an angel peering over the

pillows. A companion piece — a vanity — has the likeness of the same angel on it.

**DISPLAY CASES** in the museum contain items like a dinner bell from the old Owen Hotel which was located at the corner of what is now Farmington Road and Grand River. Downstairs, visitors can find a restored Knabe player-grand piano in the parlor. The kitchen evokes the art deco period of the 1920s complete with a bunwarmer built over the radiator.

Members of the Farmington Historical Commission are asking residents to donate small items of local significance to the museum and plan to buy other pieces to finish the home decor.

"We need oriental rugs, paintings and artwork, furniture, the decorative arts — things like sculpture, china and glassware," said Mary Howard Stober, chairman of the museum interior decorating committee.

and understanding of the legislative process that will enable me to be an effective representative for my district and for Michigan," Rosen said.

He supports tax incentives for business, an indexing of personal tax rates, and low-interest loans for students.

LEVIN, 50, lives in Southfield. He was born in Detroit and was a Berkeley resident for 17 years. He has advanced degrees from the University of Chicago and Columbia University and a law degree from Harvard. He served three terms on the Oakland County Board of Supervisors and was elected to the state Senate in 1964. An attorney, he has law offices in Southfield.

In 1979, President Jimmy Carter appointed Levin to the Agency for International Development in the State Department. Levin remained there until 1981.

"I'm rooted in this district and I believe I could represent all of this district right away," Levin said. His background in the district, coupled

with his experience in Washington, gives him the expertise to solve Michigan's problems, Levin said. He cited the economy as a top concern.

According to Levin, the new district is about 58 percent Democratic and he predicts the winner of the Democratic primary has a strong chance of winning in November.

Ross, 39, is a Southfield resident and former co-director of Michigan Citizens' Lobby and executive director of Common Cause. He worked as an aide to Reps. John Dingell and Neil Stabler and U.S. Sen. Joseph Tydings. Ross, who has degrees from University of Michigan and Princeton, was elected to the 15th District state Senate seat after defeating Democratic incumbent Daniel Cooper in the 1978 primary.

Ross said he sees the open seat as "an opportunity to take the fight for Michigan's future to Washington."

"Michigan has a potentially bright future, but I don't think it's possible unless there are some major changes made in national policy," Ross said.
