Babe Zaharias Tourney benefits cancer society

The ball is rolling once again for the seventh annual Babe Zaharias Invitational Golf Tournament, to be held Aug. 9 at Farmington Country Club in Farmington Hills.

Esther Quilte of Franklin and a member of Farmington Country Club, chairwoman of the 1982 event, and committee members have set a goal of \$50,000 to benefit the American Cancer Society.

More than 288 women golfers will

compete in the best-ball foursome for 18-hole stroke play in accordance with the USGA rules and regulations. Golfers from 20 area country clubs will compete in the tournament. There will be two shot-gun starts, with the morning group teeing off at 8 a.m. and the afternoon players at 2 p.m.

Mildred "Babe" Dedrickson Zaharias developed cancer in 1953 but continued to play golf, and won her third U.S.

Open Title in 1954. To memorialize her courage and determination, the American Cancer Society established the Babe Zaharias Invitational Tournament.

The Detroit area inter-club tournament has continued to grow in participation and income from its beginning in 1976. The first tournament raised \$8,000, and some 144 golfers participated.

Last year's tournament at

Meadowbrook Country Club in Northville raised \$48,000.

Awards will be presented for the lowest gross and lowest net scores. The two winning teams will compete in the Walter Hagen-Babe Zaharias State Finals in September at Boyne Highlands.

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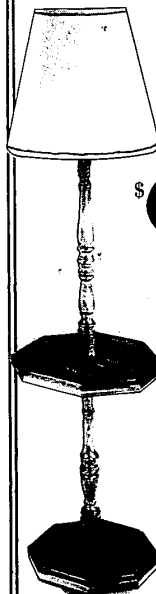
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
