I plan to reduce my family's salt in-take by using more herbs in my cook-ing. I have planted several different ones in my yard but really don't know how to use them or keep them over the winter months. Where can I get that in-formation?

Using herbe in cooking can be an adventure. They enhance the simplest foods, giving even everyday dishes agournet quality. You don't say he you letter which herbe you have planted in your garden so it would be impossible for me to make specific suggestions. There are, however, excellent books available from the public library to helm our along.

Perserving herbs for use year-round is a relatively simple procedure. Most can be preserved by drying. Just the small bunches of like herbs together and hand upside down in a room with good ventilation. They can also beyread loosely on screening or cheese cloth to dry. Herbs should be kept cool while drying and protected from sunlight to insure good flavor.

When herbs are dry and brittle to the touch, crush and store in covered labeled glass jars.

attion in employment, she said. That is a already done by the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission.

From voluminous files, she drew a jamphalet containing a statement made by Phylin Schlafly in a TV debate with Criffiths.

Schlafly claimed ERA would do nothing for women in employment. Griffiths is quoted as responding. To bever claimed it would.

Her perception of the amendment is that it would make state and federal laws sex neutral.

"Under ERA, we couldn't have separate sex activities such as women's colleges and sorvities. Many federal and state laws that benefit women would be out if it passes."

"DESPITE HER opposition to ERA, Dennelly thinks the law that legislates equal opportunity in employment is "a good law." She also brands as "a really good law." She like X of the omnibus education bill of 1972.

Title IX outlaws sex discrimination in educational institutions receiving deferal aid and has been particularly noticeable in improving the lot of females in school sports.
