

A happy Inman jumps to Motor City horse crown

Paula Inman knew she had clinched another title.

Just after clearing the final obstacle in the Amateur-Owner Jumper Jump-Off competition in the Motor City Horse Show last Thursday, Inman peered back and undauntedly smiled at her parents who were tensely nestled in the stands.

There were still three horses left to show in the Jump-Off at the Bloomfield Open Hunt Club, but the Inman family appeared confident that Paula's no-

fault ride of 29.481 seconds on One-for-the-Road would hold up.

Although two of the last three horses successfully cleared the seven-jump course without a fault, none of their times could match Inman's.

So, when Queensland, a North Carolina horse owned and ridden by Lee Reynolds finished the last run with a time of 40.682, the Inman family rejoiced near their private box on the North Side of the Red Duffly Main Ring.

It was a grand moment for the horse-loving family from Farmington Hills. Inman was runner-up in the Large Junior Working Hunter competition a year

ago, so winning an advanced class in front of her hometown folks was a special occasion.

"AFTER I finished my ride, I was looking back towards my mom and dad just to show them how happy I was," said Inman, who also rode her other horse — Everon — to an eighth-place finish in the same Jump-Off.

Inman, 18 years old and a graduate of Farmington Our Lady of Mercy High School, rode both Everon and One-for-the-Road to perfect rides in the first round of the competition.

Everon's first run was clean over the

first half of the 12-jump course, but the horse grazed the bars — neither of which fell — on the final two jumps to cause some anxious moments. Later in the first round, One-for-the-Road was flawless through the entire ride.

There were eight perfect rides in the starting field of 34 which qualified for the Jump-Off (held immediately after the opening round, but on a shorter course where riders shoot for time and accuracy in clearing the seven obstacles).

Everon, the newest of Inman's three horses, was first, but the inexperience proved costly as he completely

knocked over two hurdles. One-for-the-Road, a chestnut gelding standing 16 hands, one-inch in height, looked elegant in clearing all hurdles and registering the best time.

"THE TOUGHEST part of the Jump-Off is making the tight turns to the big vertical (jumps)," said Inman. "In this instance, they were all right turns — and the right turns are normally the hardest (for One-for-the-Road)."

"I wanted to do real well here at home because I wanted to show everyone how well we've been doing this year. I've had (one-for-the-Road) for

four years, and we know each other. He really tried hard for me today, and I was really pleased."

Inman, the national Junior Jumping Division runner-up last year, has been red hot this season.

She opened the year with two wins in Florida, then moved on to a jumping division win in King of Prussia, Pa. She also won a jumping division two weeks ago in Upperville, Va.

"I've been working real hard at it," said Inman, who is coached by former Bloomfield Hills resident Katie Monahan. "I'm happy it's all paid off for me."

Waterford gears for race weekend

While the unlimited hydroplane boats thunder across the Detroit River, Waterford Hills will host a full schedule of road racing this weekend.

A variety of production sports cars, open-wheel formula cars and racing sedans — all driven by highly skilled amateur race car drivers — is set to hit the tight-and-twisty Waterford Hills circuit both Saturday and Sunday.

This is the third of a series of six races at Waterford, which is celebrating its 24th year of hosting club racers. The 1 1/4-mile course is hilly with 13 right and left turns.

The English Car Club will highlight the weekend with an appearance on Sunday. Members of the club will gather their British autos in a parade lap around the grounds starting at 11:30 a.m.

Practice and qualifying begins 10 a.m. Saturday, while the actual race gets under way at 1:30 p.m. Sunday, racing begins at noon.

Admission is \$3 Saturday, \$5 Sunday and \$6 for both days. Children under 12 are free.

Waterford Hills is located 1/4-mile east of Dixie Highway on Waterford Road.

Softball City has league openings for Men's, Women's and Co-ed teams, starting July 12. There is a \$240 entry fee.

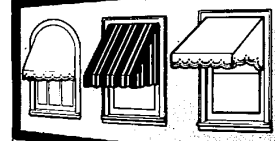
There is also a Tuesday-morning men's double-header league scheduled to begin June 28. The \$275 entry fee for this league includes umpires.
