## Poverty: 'Women, children first'

Most poor people in America are women, and they have men to thank for

That's the opinion of Helen Milliken, wife of Gov. William G. Milliken, and other women's rights activists. Mrs. Milliken shared her thoughts recently with the national membership of the Society of Women Engineers in Dearborn.

She charged that male legislators have failed to pass the Equal Rights Amendment and how men in high-level federal positions - including President Reagan — are cutting the social programs they desperately need.

"THE FACE of poverty is overwhelmingly female," Mrs. Millik-en said.
"Sixty-one percent of those on Medi-caid are women, 69 percent of all flood starmps go to women, and 89 percent of all those collecting ADC are women," she said.
"Three out of four families in need

are headed by women. When it comes to poverty, it's women and children first,' she added.
Noting that only 14 percent of American families still have husbands as the sole wage earners and mothers staying home raising two children, she said there is no longer an excuse for underpayment for females.

"It would make centers which administer birth control devices to teenagers inform their parents and in turn

feared.

"By forcing poor women to have too many children too soon, we're doing nothing to reduce poverty," she added. "If women to don't have the right to decide when or if they can bear chil-dren, then they're denied their free-dom. Without the exercise of choice, a woman is merely an instrument," she said.

IT HAS BEEN 59 years since the Equal Rights Amendment was first in-troduced by U.S. Rep. Alice Paul, the state's first lady said.

"It's time to put our convictions into action. For decades we've had debates on whether women deserve equal rights. By the year 2000, almost 90 percent of all women will be in the marketplace. And it's a crime that women still only earn an average of 59 cents for every dollar a man earns," she added

ed.
"On the average, women college graduates earn the same (salary) as male high-school dropouts," she said.
