

Schoolcraft Announces Program For 1970 Summer Music School

Enrollments are now being accepted for the fourth annual Schoolcraft College summer music school, according to Wayne Dunlap, director.

Open to advanced young musicians, the school will offer four weeks of daily classes starting July 6, and will again concentrate on chamber music, music theory for performers, music literature, and special courses in style and musicianship.

Singletons Plan Dance

The Dearborn-Livonia Singletons have scheduled a spring dance beginning at 9 p.m. April 3, in the Continental Room of the Lincoln Inn, Southfield and Dix Roads, Lincoln Park.

The Daryl Smith Trio will provide the musical background for dancing.

AN ADDITION to the school this year, Dunlap said, will be a class for young composers. "We are able to provide an unusual opportunity this year through the presence of Robert W. Jones, who is with us as composer-in-residence to the college community," Dunlap said.

Jones will conduct a class for young composers several days each week, and participants will have the opportunity of hearing their work performed by the student ensembles.

Faculty again will be composed of well-known professional and performing musicians, a number of whom are members of the Detroit Symphony.

In addition to Dunlap and Jones, faculty members are Emily Mutter Austin and Inez Hull Redman, violin. David

Ireland, viola. Mario DiFiore, cello. Marian Wingert, bass. Roy Ernst, flute. Robert Coward, oboe. Oliver Green, clarinet. James Tamburini, brass. Donald Morelock, piano: and Allen Shaffer, theory.

MORELOCK, a member of the college music department faculty, will offer, as part of the work in the school for pianists, classes in sight reading and accompanying.

Shaffer is a former member of the Schoolcraft faculty and is now completing work on his doctoral degree at the University of Michigan. He will assist Dunlap in the direction of the school.

Student ensembles will include a full orchestra, wind ensembles and chamber music for all instruments. Four student concerts are scheduled, including a chamber music concert on July 24, and a special awards concert on July 27.

AS IN THE PAST, Dunlap

said, outstanding performers among the students will be invited to join the professional Court Festival Orchestra for performances during the college's Summer Music Festival.

Morello, Schory To Appear

Famed Jazz Drummer Joe Morello will join Dick Schory and his Percussion Pops Orchestra in a 1 1/2 hour concert beginning at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 9, in Plymouth.

The concert, sponsored by the Plymouth High School Bands, will begin at 8 p.m. in the Plymouth High School gymnasium. The school is located at the corner of Main and Church Streets.

Tickets, priced at \$2, are available at the Melody House and Anderson Music, both in Plymouth, and Hammill Music in Livonia.

Water Color Show At EMU

The Michigan Water Color Society will hold its 24th annual exhibition at Eastern Michigan University through April 17. Covering a broad subject area, 57 paintings by approximately 30 Michigan artists will be shown in the Still Hall Art Gallery.

THE SCHORY GROUP comes to Plymouth from a Carnegie Hall concert on April 7. The orchestra appeared in Plymouth during 1968 and Schory was a conductor for the Plymouth High Band during the National Midwest Band Clinic in Chicago last December.

Morello has won every major jazz poll in the world and has been called the world's greatest jazz drummer. During his years as drummer with the Dave Brubeck Quartet, Morello won international acclaim for his inventive ideas and fantastic finger control technique.

He began playing drums when he was 15. By the time Morello was 17, he was already drawing the attention of professional musicians.

SCHORY'S PERCUSSION Pops Orchestra includes 20 musicians with three top-notch percussionists. Schory is a former percussionist with the Chicago Symphony and has won the "Grammy" award as "Best Arranger of the Year." The 1968 concert of the group drew an audience of 1,300. Some 2,000 tickets are available for the April 9 concert.

Pharmacy History Shown In Exhibit

An exhibit telling the story of America's pharmaceutical manufacturing industry through the history of Parke, Davis & Co. is currently on display in the Detroit Historical Museum.

Entitled "Focus on Pharmacy," the display will continue through July 26.

A SELECTION of artifacts, historical products, devices and instruments from the George A. Bender collection of 1,762 pharmaceutical items will detail the growth of the industry.

In addition, the exhibit is being supplemented by the museum's own medical collection. The display theme begins in the Civil War era when medicine was made by local druggists who concocted their own pills, tonics and ointments.

War and the westward movement created a need for large quantities of uniformly prepared medicines and the industry was born.

BENDER is the former director of Institutional Advertising for Parke, Davis & Company.

The museum is located at Woodward and Kirby. Hours are from 9:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday.
