Plant some trees to cool your house

It's both a bit early and a bit late to worry about the greenery around your house. It's early because the really hot weather hasn't hit, and the cold weather is five months off.

It's late because the best time to plant green things is the spring. But you can take a look at what you have and decide what you should have.

Fast-growing shade trees can be planted in strategic spots around the house to shade the house from the sun in summer. Deciduous trees are best for blocking the sun because they shed their leaves in the fall and allow the maximum amount of sun in the winter when you need it.

Evergreens are dandy for wind breaks to slow the cold winter winds, but since they remain full the year around, they are poor choices on the south and west side of your house.

But evergreens can do a fine job of keeping the external unit of a central air conditioner cool. A cooler condenser unit means the system doesn't have to work as hard. That saves energy and mon-

But placing an evergreen too close to an external central unit can block the necessary air flow, creat-ing the hot-air problem you sought to avoid by planting an evergreen in the first place.

So don't plant a shrub too close — the York air conditioning people recommend a minimum dis-tance between the compressor unit and shading shrubbery of two feet. This probably will mean hacking off the new growth once a year, but that beats raking leaves or cleaning out the condenser unit — unless yours is easier to clean than mine.

A heavily shaded home benefits with or without air conditioning. Air is cooler in the shade, so an open window allows the house to share the cool.

WITH AIR conditioning, the sun is kept at bay, especially if trees are planted to shade your southern windows from 10 a.m to 4 p.m.

Trees recommended by one nurseryman include maple, oak, sycamore and silver maple. But don't plant a maple any closer than 40 feet from your house or you may have problems with roots. Your local nurseryman is the expert in tree selection.

Certain types of rhododendron are evergreens, so an accumulation of leaves is not a problem. Rhodo-dendrons may be pruned immediately after each flowering season.

Mugho pine and euonymous can grow two to four feet high and as much as four feet in diameter, but they can be trimmed.

Trim the spiked growth in the center of the mugho pine each year to keep it from growing an additional three inches yearly.


