

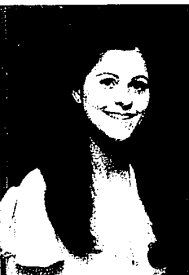


Robinson-Kelel

Registration opens for Kids Day Pet Show

Official entry blanks are now available to youngsters who wish to enter their pet in one of 10 categories of the 15th annual Pet Show.

The show is a traditional part of Founders Festival. Pets go up for judging this year at 1 p.m. Tuesday, July 27 in Farmington City Park, on Shivassee Road between Farmington and

Power roads during Kids Day activities. Contest rules are explained on the official entry blank which is available at Pets 'N Particulars and the adjacent Plaza Veterinary Hospital, sponsors of the show. They are in the Farmington Plaza, on Grand River, west of Orchard Lake Road. Blanks and rules are also available at the children's section at

both Farmington and Farmington Hills Community Libraries.

Entry forms must be returned to Pets 'N Particulars before 10 a.m. on the day of the contest.

The contest is open to all area residents under 16 years of age. Each contestant may enter only one category in the show, but another member of the family may enter the same pet in a different category using a separate entry blank.

Trophies are waiting for the best presentation of a caged pet, the pet with the waggiest tail, the most unusual pet, the shaggiest pet, the best dressed pet and the two most look-alike pets.

In the most talented pet competition, the pet will have 30 seconds to perform. In the laziest pet competition, the pet must be a live animal.

In the tallest pet category, horses will be allowed entry. In the smallest pet competition, no insects will be allowed.

All contestants must handle their own pets. No parents will be allowed in the show ring.
