Calligraphy show

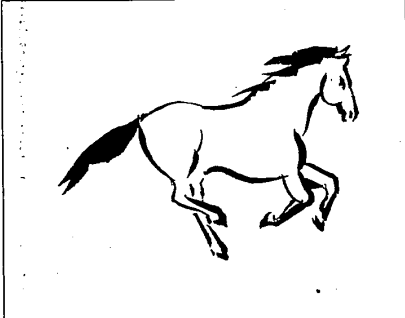

Students make holograms in summer college class

Kimberly Heussner, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Douglas G. Heussner of Bloomfield Hills, is learning to make holograms, three-dimensional photographs by use of laser light, while at Erskine College.

Foundation (NSF) program "Holography, Laser Photography" conducted for five summers at Erskine. Holograms prepared for those programs received front-page coverage in a national holography journal.

The junior at Lutheran High School Northwest, Farmington Hills, is among 28 high-school students from nine states participating in the program. Research in Science at Erskine (RISE). She was nominated by her high-school science teachers and selected on the basis of her high school record.

When funding for NSF programs was eliminated this year, Erskine took over sponsorship of the program adding computer programming and field biology. Founded in 1839 by the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church as South Carolina's earliest four-year denominational college, Erskine is a coeducational liberal arts college of 700 students. It is located midway between Atlanta, Ga., and Charlotte, N.C.
