

Triathlon planned for Burroughs Farms

Burroughs Farms, a 585-acre recreational resort in Brighton, will be the site of a "Burroughs Farms Triathlon" Sunday, Aug. 15.

A field of 500 entrants is expected to participate in the three-part competition — bicycling, running and swimming.

Starting at 9 a.m., contestants will ride a bicycle for 25 miles on a course adjacent to the resort, run seven miles through inside acreage, and swim a one-mile course on Crooked Lake. There will be seven classes — four for men and three for women — separated by age groups. The minimum age is 15.

All competitors upon paying the \$15 entry fee will receive an official T-shirt. All finishers will receive a be-ribboned medalion. The first three finishers in each class will win a trophy.
