THE TOUR BEGAN at the Charles Davison home, 1094 Lincoln Court. Here the owners have used excellent taste with flower placement. There's a

The Howard Sumerss, 1067 Lincoin Court, have an easy garden to maintain because of its simplicity along with good accents "to copy." The easy-to-maintain patio has pots of bright red geranimus and 6-foot benches on each side, made by Sumera. The benches were purchased as a package from a local tumber yard.


