Church of God Youth Attend Unusual Meeting

Participating in one of America's unusual youth conventions this summer were seven delegates from the Livonia community. They were among more than 4,000 persons in Minneapolis, Aug. 22-25 for the biennial International Youth Convention of the Church of God.

Following the theme, "Power to Be," the program format was designed to help young people in their "researching, questing for the meaning and purpose of life," according to the Rev. Kenneth Prunty, director of youth ministries of the Church of God at its world offices in Anderson, Ind.

Small depth involvement groups (DIG) replaced large conference sessions of previous conventions, Rev. Prunty said.

Seminars were held in the areas of drama, communication, science, and sports.

Concerns, and cultural groups toured the Twin Cities area in the spirit of ministry—in what Rev. Prunty called a "Thrust outward—journey inward."

Sister M. Emeline, O.P., has been appointed assistant superintendent of Archdiocese of Detroit schools, with responsibilities affecting over 140,000 pupils in over 250 elementary schools.

This is Michigan's second largest single school organization, surpassed only by Detroit's public school system. The Archdiocese is comprised of Wayne, Oakland, Macomb, Lapeer, Lawer, Monroe, St. Clair and Washtenaw counties.

Ziers, superintendent of Catholic schools, said she will replace Sister Gertrude Marie, S.C., who has been called by her order, the Sisters of Charity in Ohio and Michigan, to be its counselor and supervisor. Her title also was assistant superintendent for elementary schools.

Fall Bible Class To Begin Sept. 10

An interdenominational Bible class meeting in Ward Memorial Presbyterian Church, Livonia, will begin its fall classes Tuesday, Sept. 10, from 9:30 to 11 a.m.

Twenty-one different religious groups are represented among those who have attended in other years, including Roman Catholic, Greek Orthodox, Jewish, Mormon, Episcopal, Lutheran, Baptist, Christian Scientist, Presbyterian.

The subject of this year's study will be the Life of Christ, using the four Gospels. The aim is to show how to apply the Bible to everyday life. Study materials, costing three dollars and covering two years of study, will be available at the first class. Six women will take care of three nurseries, for infants, toddlers, and preschoolers.

The class is taught by Mrs. Bartlett L. Hess, wife of the pastor of Ward Memorial Presbyterian Church. It began 10 years ago in the basement of Mrs. Gordon Hay, formerly of Coventry Gardens. The ten or so in attendance at the first meeting brought friends, and those brought more friends, until now the average attendance is 250, with 458 registered and covering two years of members.

Mrs. Hess also teaches classes at the First Presbyterian Church of Birmingham, and speaks at numerous retreats, luncheons, and banquets.

Recent articles she has written have appeared in "Home Life" magazine, American Lutheran Church Women's "Scope," "Sunday Digest" and "Today." She also writes Bible study materials for teachers of adult classes, for "Scripture Press Publications."

She and her husband recently returned from leading a tour of the Scandinavian countries. Formerly they have traveled extensively in Europe, around the world, and led tours of Bible lands.
