Synagogues Back Forests In Israel

The United Synagogue of America, an association of conservative congregations throughout the nation, has embarked on an ambitious project in Israel—a forest to be planted on Jewish National Fund land near Jerusalem.

Each congregation in the movement is being urged to be represented in the United Synagogue Forest.

A CONGREGATION can dedicate a garden of 100 trees, a grove of 1,000 trees, a woodland of 2,500 trees, a park of 5,000 trees, or its own forest of 10,000 trees. Each tree costs \$250.

Each congregation participating in the United Synagogue Forest will have its name inscribed on a plaque which will be a permanent display.

A booklet of tree certificates has been devised to permit congregation members to issue their own tree certificates to relatives and friends whom they wish to honor.
