THE LAMPS will be installed by Central Installation Co. at a competitive price of \$29, providing the lamp is "planted" within 60 feet of the house. Slightly higher charges will

be made for those farther away from the house or for those necessitating crossing of sidewalks or driveways.

Lamp orders must be placed before May 1 at the City Hall. Posters and pictures of the lamps are on display at area supermarkets, in the City Hall and at other frequently visited locations in the city.
