From bugs to weeds, **Extension Service can** help solve problems

Want to know why your tomatoes are wilting? What can be done about a tree sprawling into your neighbor's yard? How about a canning question? Or how to get that blood stains off of your brand new velvet couch?

These are some of the hundreds of questions the Oakland County Coopera-tive Extension Service staffers answer

"We get questions from people on the way to prepare fields to plant corn. Or how much is a cord of wood?" said Wayne Nierman, division manager of the County Extension Division.

During summer, the most commonly asked questions about natural resources include: how to build a pond, how to control aguatic weeds; where fish to stock tonds can be bought; and sod problems. "In the winter, we get a lot of questions on the effect of ice on lakes and ponds," Nierman added. Agriculture specialist. John Leech fields questions from farmers. "Questions about insects, diseases, pesticides and nutrient difficiences are popular from commercial farmers. Small farmers want to know why eggs don't hatch or how to feed a pig." Leech said.

"We have people grow certain foods then not know how to prepare them," she said.

"We also try to help low-income people learn nutrition and cooking techniques. Some people get food supplements and don't know how to prepare them. Others may have to cook with only a hot plate and not know how. We help them with these types of problems,"Thieleke added.


