

Alpern leads first flight

Redford golfer wins 3rd O&E title

Experience mastered youth at Livonia's Whispering Willows Golf Course Tuesday.

Carol Trombly fired a 38 on the opening nine holes, then held off the challenge of Gerylann Repasky to win the championship flight of the Observer & Eccentric/Whispering Willows Women's Golf Tournament.

For Trombly, a Redford resident, it was her third O&E title in four years.

Her strong start, which included birdies on the first and sixth holes, enabled her to open up a five-stroke advantage over Repasky, a 17-year-old Livonian who had a 43 on the front nine.

Trombly, who played in the same threesome as Repasky and defending O&E championship flight titlist Kathy Heriford of Farmington Hills, finished with a 43 for an 81 over the par-71, 5,772-yard course. Repasky closed to within two strokes by the final hole, carding a 40 over the last nine for an 83.

Heriford struggled with a 51 on the front nine and finished with a 95 total.

TROMBLY'S PUTTING caused her some problems over the last nine holes, but she was never in serious trouble of losing her lead.

"I don't know how many of those I had," the champion said, referring to short putts that failed to drop. On the 18th hole, Trombly drove her tee shot near the water hazard on the left of the fairway and clipped a shot short of the green.

After reaching the green, she three-putted for a double-bogey six. Her second putt, from about six feet, ringed the cup and stayed out.

The winner had few troubles with her two-over-par on the front nine, but it still wasn't a victory that came easy. Besides missing three short putts on the last five holes, Trombly had problems with her wedge, a club she said she "finally just put away."

Repasky's 83 tied her with Karen Johnson of Birmingham for second place. In a playoff, Repasky birdied the first hole to claim second. Johnson,

carrying a 17-handicap, settled for best low net score with a 66.

IN THE FIRST FLIGHT, Zoe Alpern of Troy defended her title by firing a 43-45 for an 88 total. A year ago, Alpern carded an 87 to win the championship.

"I scrambled all day," Alpern said. "I felt like Tom Watson at the British Open," she added, referring to Watson's winning the title as other contenders beat themselves.

Glenna Daniels of Rochester was a distant second with a 46-47, 93 total. Diane Marmion of Livonia was third with a 49-46, 94.

Tying for low net honors in first flight was Laurie Bogart and Norma Ferrick, each with a 78.

In second flight, Livonia's Rosemary Moran had a 51-51 for a 102, one stroke ahead of Irene Curmi of Westland (50-53, 103) and two in front of Joyce Mitchell of Bloomfield Hills (52-52, 104). Joan Marmion of Livonia had a low net best with a 68.

Only 48 women registered for this year's tournament, one-third fewer than a year ago.

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Angels top league

The Farmington Angels are flying high these days under coach John Magee.

The Angels, a recreation women's soccer team, wrapped up their third straight Great Lakes Women's Soccer League championship with a 6-1 victory over the Huron Valley Grass Kickers Sunday at Schoolcraft College.

The Angels, 9-0 in league matches, will own the title even if they lose their remaining two matches.

In the nine league games, the Angels have allowed just five goals while scoring 55. The team has lost just one game in its three years in the circuit.

"I have an excellent bunch of girls," said Magee, a 60-year-old tool machinist with a long soccer background in England, explaining the team's

success. "They do what I tell them, and now it's paying off."

Julie Gnaul, the Angels' inside forward, scored two goals against Huron Valley, bringing her league season total to 14. Nancy Glynn, the team's leading scorer with 16 markers, managed a goal against Huron Valley. Sue Ferguson scored twice for the Angels, and teammate Martha Glynn added another goal. Colleen Miller was in goal for the winners.

In an earlier Great Lakes League game, the Angels came from behind to beat the Farmington Fury, 2-1, at Schoolcraft. The Fury led, 1-0, at halftime, but the Angels used single goals by Nancy Glynn and Caroline Trout to pull it out. The loss gave the Fury a 3-2 record.

The Angels travel to Flint on Sunday, Aug. 15.

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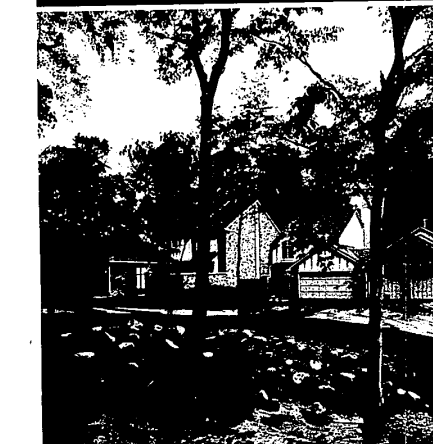
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
