

Dems like Blanchard

Oakland backs Patterson, Ruppe

Although Oakland County Prosecutor L. Brooks Patterson placed third in the GOP gubernatorial primary, he carried his home county of Oakland.

The law-and-order prosecutor received 39,693 Oakland votes, followed by the GOP nominee, Farmington Hills insurance executive Richard Headlee, who had 30,566 Oakland votes.

Other Republicans: Lt. Gov. James Brickley received 25,743 Oakland votes and Sen. Jack Welborn of Kalamazoo logged 2,247 of the county's share.

On the Democratic side, Oakland voters gave state gubernatorial nominee James Blanchard, congressman from Pleasant Ridge, 48,812 votes; Ingham County Commissioner Zolton Perency, 10,881; former state Sen. William Fitzgerald, 9,222; Sen. Kerry Kammer of Clarkston, 7,494; state Sen. Edward Pierce of Ann Arbor, 5,318; state Sen. David Plawewski of Dearborn Heights, 6,035; and Lapeer County minister John Safran, 841.

OAKLAND VOTERS overwhelmingly supported Democrat Sen. Donald W. Riegle Jr. for renomination, even though it was an uncontested race. Riegle took 58,854 votes.

On the Republican U.S. Senate race, nominee Philip E. Ruppe got 32,606 Oakland votes, and former Troy Mayor Robert J. Huber got 25,426 of the county votes, while William S. Ballenger got 16,181 and Deane Baker got 10,859.

In the hotly contested 17th District Congressional race which covers southeast Oakland and northwest Wayne counties, former legislator Sander Levin of Southfield won the Democratic nomination, sweeping Oakland County with 17,532 votes. State Sen. Doug Ross of Oak Park got 11,583 votes, Detroit City Councilwoman Maryann Mahaffey 4,117, Patrick F. O'Hara 2,165 and Agnes Mary Mansour 1,542.

On the Republican side, attorney Gerald E. Rosen won the nomination

with 9,808 votes. His contender, businessman Morris Goldberg, got 3,307 votes.

IN THE 15TH STATE SENATE DISTRICT, which includes Southfield, Farmington and Farmington Hills, Sen. Jack Faxon walked away with the Democratic nomination with 16,295 votes. He was followed by Sen. Dan Wilson with 8,412 votes, former director of Com-

mon Cause Alan Feuer with 4,328 votes, Daniel Reddy with 802 votes, Philip Marcuse with 692 votes and Jack Kaye Work with 583 votes.

Attorney John Anderson won the GOP nomination with 5,767 votes. He was followed by former Judge S. James Clarkson with 2,969, David S. Pickering with 2,768 votes, Richard Corey with 1,850 votes and Markus Simon with 1,011 votes.

In the 16th State Senate District, which includes Troy, Birmingham, Royal Oak and Bloomfield, state Rep. Doug Cruce of Troy narrowly won the Republican nomination with 7,630 votes. He was followed by former state Rep. David Campbell with 7,490 votes, Troy City Councilwoman Jeanne Stine with 4,237 votes and public relations man William McMaster with 2,017 votes.
