

Cycling safety class a large success

The 1982 Detroit Metropolitan Area Motorcycle Safety Education Program taught more students than any other program in the state for the second straight year.

The sponsors for the 1982 programs were the Detroit Public Schools, Macomb Community College, Oakland Community College, and Southgate Adult Education. The Michigan Office of Highway Safety and Planning and the Motorcycle Safety Foundation funded the program, which was supplemented by a \$25 fee paid by the students.

The courses consist of eight hours of classroom work and twelve hours of motorcycle riding in a range situation. The motorcycles are loaned to the program by various area dealers. In times of high unemployment, the support that the dealers provide is essential since you can't learn to ride without a motorcycle, explained program coordinator Vince Consiglio.

Motorcycles were loaned by Anderson's of Pontiac, Bright Kawasaki, Davis Honda Sales, General Cycle, Honda City, Honda Tour 'N' Trail, Honda Center of Warren, Jonino Inc., M.G. Sales and Village Cycle Inc.

Other businesses that supported the program by giving discounts to graduates are Andy Pele BMW, P&P Cycle Products Inc., Parts Galore, Detroit-Metro Harley Davidson, American Lock & Key, Anderson's of Pontiac and ABATE of Michigan.

The 1982 program had a 20 percent increase over the 1981 program in the number of students completing the program. During the 1982 program legislation was passed providing a tougher state endorsement test.

The Detroit-Metro Program used the Motorcycle Operators Skills Test (MOST), which is considered to be the toughest licensing test, at the end of all novice, better biking and instructor preparation courses.
