## OCC offers CPR class

A cardiovascular rehabilitation program which combines a cardiovascular fitness program with lecture/discussion sessions is being offered for the first time this fall at the Highland Lakes campus of Oakland Community College.

The course is designed for individuals with cardiovascular problems or those in a high risk category. At the onset of the program, a personalized exercise plan will be developed for each participant. The "prescription" will be based upon the individual's medical history and the results of an exercise/stress test administered via his or her physician.

The program is ideal for patients who have had heart surgery, a heart attack or a stroke as well as for those who are being treated for coronary artery disease, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, asthma and other related illnesses," said Rita Paudman, exercise physiologist and program coordinator.

Medically supervised exercise sessions are scheduled for 7:30-8:30 a.m. Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays for 15 weeks in the Highland Lakes Physical Education Building.

Each session will include 10 minutes of warm-up, 25 minutes of aerobic activity and a 10 minute cool-down period. A physician, nurse and exercise physiologist will be on hand at all times during exercise.

## Cash discounts offered on gas

I for one am happy to see that those of us who pay cash can now get a discount when buying gas. Do you know of other merchants that do the same thing?

Merchants prefer cash-paying customers because when merchandise is charged on credit cards a percentage of each sale goes to the company that issued the card. Exceptions may be retailers who carry their own charge systems. However in many cases, even house charges can cost the merchant more in paperwork than they can gain in carrying charges or good will. Hence the return to popularity of cash purchases.

If you pay for purchases with cash instead of with credit cards, merchants are allowed to give you discounts in any amount they wish. This was not always the case. Until recently, discounts were limited to 5 percent for cash customers in stores that offered credit card options.

Merchants that offer discounts usually let customers know by posting the fact on signs in their stores or in their advertisements. But a good consumer knows that it never hurts to ask.
