

DNR testing dumped 'Scorch'

Swen said yesterday that he was writing a report that will go to village officials next week.

"The brown clay acts as a sealer, and nothing gets through," said Swen.

"However, there always exists the possibility that there is a sand or gravel hole in the clay that could go all the way through."

The engineering firm researched the logs kept by the well diggers and has also asked the DNR to test at least one village resident's well at the request of Village President John Verdon.

Verdon, Swen and several residents interviewed said they are waiting for the DNR test results. Verdon said the

village would want to have those results before initiating any well testing on its own.

SWEN SAID the DNR originally said all test results would be back in seven days. "If now they're saying it will take weeks, we'll probably try to hurry them up."

"As a matter of probabilities, chances are about one in 1,000 that anything could seep into a neighbor's well. But even that's not a chance you want to take."

"There's not a real strong cause for alarm, but for my own peace of mind, I would want to get my well tested."

Dee Lyne said she would "gladly pay the couple of hundred dollars to call a

testing lab and have our well tested, but first a lab must know what it would be testing for."

"Bunkus!" she said of the several-week time period estimated by the DNR. "They could have results in 24 to 48 hours if they wanted to."

EUGENE KAWECKI, who lives on Wellington, said, "We're very concerned and have written to the DNR asking them to move quickly to determine whether the local water wells are affected at all."

"We have great concern for safety and health," said Kaweck. "Some wells are shallow, and we have no way of knowing how we might be affected."

Said Wendell Smith, who lives on

Inkster: "We're at least 800 feet from the golf course and we're up on a hill. I don't think we're concerned. I think people directly south of 13 Mile in a low area should be more concerned."

ARNOLD AGREE lives on Willoughby Court north of the dump site and is a member of Franklin Hills County Club. "This was a housekeeping chore at the club, something we had no knowledge of. I'm sure the club is taking this seriously," he said.

"Four ourselves we have no concern," Agree continued, "but I would say if I lived within 300 or 400 feet of there I would want my water tested."

Investigator Laird at the DNR said the department's Water Quality Division "is doing research on the chemical properties of Scorch now. It's not one of the more common brands and is not on the market any longer."

Laird said of possible dangers: "If there haven't been any ill effects after three years, a little more time shouldn't make too much difference."

"There doesn't appear to be any imminent health threat," he said.

\$1.4 million sewer separation eyed

TO INSTALL the new sanitary sewer lines, Deadman says half of the roads in the district will be dug up to lay the pipe. Since the public hearings won't be held until late October or early November, construction is at least a year away, providing council gives the project its approval.

While only 25-40 homes experience a frequent problem with flooded basements when the storm water overloads the combined system, city offi-

cials say residents living on higher ground are contributing to the problem and should pay to remedy it. Combined sanitary/storm sewers are no longer permitted to be built.

Homes suffering the brunt of the flooding are located along the Alta Loma Street sewer affecting homes on that street, Orchard, State, Liberty and Cast, among others.

The inadequate sewer outlet is located at Farmington Road and Orchard Street.

"Preliminary engineering review

has determined that the 33-inch outlet has sufficient capacity to handle a one-year storm," Deadman says, "whereas, the sewers located on Alta Loma only have capacity to handle a half-year storm."
