PLO weakened by bombs, Israeli spokesman says

The Palestine Liberation Organization will never again have the strength it displayed during the terrorist group's two-month stay in southern Lebanon, an Israel ambasador has concluded. Ambasador Moshe Arens, in Southfield lawek, told reporters that the PLD will be weaker after its evacuation from Belrut. "In Lebanon, they (PLD) were operating as if it had a state of its own," Arens said. "They had distinct advantages. They operated above ground, they had training and recruiting facilities. They could do all the things terroist weren't able to do in other countries because Leba-

non was not strong enough to fight terrorists," he said.
"The PLO had offices in other Arab countries but other governments weren't and aren't willing to put "The PLO had offices in other Arao countries but other governments weren't and aren't willing to put their regimes in jeopardy by letting them (PLO) operate in the open. They (PLO) will never again have the kind of success they enjoyed in Lebanon,"

Arens said.

Arens also said he hopes the evacuation of the PLO from Beirut will help strengthen Lebanon's

"LEBANON IS is very industrious and there is a lot of wealth there, so they will be able to rebuild. Most importantly, there will be the reconstitution of the Lebanese government," Arens explained.

Arens said he believes it could take a couple of months for all the PLO guerillas to leave Lebanon. They are beaded for Jordan, Irrag, Egypt, South Yemen, Algeria and Tunisia.

"We know there are plans for leaving PLO family behind in Lebanon. But there is nothing we can do about that," Arens said.

While calling the evacuation agreement a great victory for Isreal, he said its forceful millitary efforts to push the PLO out of Lebanon caused disagreement with the U.S. and the United Nations.

"THE PRESIDENT (Reagan) and the prime minister (Begin) shared the same goals but had differences of opinions on how to achieve those goals. It wasn't easy for the Israel and the U.S. to work to-

gether. We knew the PLO wouldn't leave without military force," Arens said.

In a written statement, Arens acknowledged that the U.S. and Israel agreed that there should be establishment of a quiet zone in southern Lebanon; the removal from Lebanon of Syrian and PLO troops followed by the withdrawal of Israeli troops and the re-establishment of a central Lebanese government.

He also said the United Nations' actions had a ne also said une United Nations actions had a negative effect on the entire negotiation process. At the United Nations, the PLO won a diplomatic victory. The General Assembly voted 120-2 to con-demn Israel and endorse Palestinian national inde-pendence.
