All blood donor centers in Wayne, Oakland and Macomb counties will be open that day from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Blood also can be donated at community blood drives to be held at Oakland, Meadowbrook and Tel-Twelve malls.

No time to donate blood on Saturday? Blood also can be donated Sunday, Sept. 5, at donor centers in Dearborn, Oak Park and Sterling Heights. On Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 5, donor centers in Wyandotte, Ann Arbor, Roseville and Livonia will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Blood can be donated by anyone in good general health between the ages of 17 through 65 years old. One donation of blood can help as many as three patients. Nearly 1,000 units of blood are used by the 75 hospitals in southeastern Michigan every day of the year.

BRINGING UP BABY

Raising children is more expensive now. New figures from the Department of Agriculture disclose that it will cost more than \$134,000 to support a child born today to age 18. (That's four times the 1950 figure). The department's estimates are based on an annual inflation rate of 8 percent; if that rises, costs will be higher, of course.

Here are some highlights from their projections:

- Housing is up to \$41,141 from 1980's \$10,487
- Food at home will cost \$32,915 against \$7,918; eating out would be \$3,700, up from \$848
- Clothing for the youngster rises to \$12,129 from \$3,662
- Medical care jumps to \$6,703 from \$1,602
- Education through high school is budgeted at \$2,286, from \$520
- Transportation is expected to cost \$20,355, as against \$5,267 in 1980, and
- All other expenses, from grooming to entertainment, are budgeted at \$15,173, up from \$3,990

These figures are averages, of course, and the department emphasizes that allowances have to be made for costs in different areas of the country; they'll be lower for a small town in Mississippi, say, and higher in a big city like Boston.

Per-child costs would be lower for a family with several young children, for there are savings in bulk food purchases and in the use of hand-me-down clothing. Family health insurance premiums cost the same whether there is one child or six.

Note, though, that even the government won't dare guess what COLLEGE educational costs will be.
