

Poet Sets Schoolcraft Reading

Poet Robert Bly will present a poetry reading at 8 p.m. Monday, April 13, in the Liberal Arts Building-theater at Schoolcraft college. Admission to the reading, which is sponsored by the college's Humanities Series, is free and is open to the public.

Bly is one of the few poets of his generation in the United States who does not teach. He makes his living translating Scandinavian fiction and by giving poetry readings throughout the country.

One of the first American poets to attack this government's involvement in Vietnam, he helped organize in 1966 "American Writers Against the Vietnam War."

BORN IN Minnesota in 1926, Bly graduated from Harvard in 1950 and after some time in New York moved to a farm in Minnesota where he decided he "could live cheaply, on less money than was needed in the city."

In 1958 he started a magazine called "The Fifties," which later became "The Sixties," and is now "The Seventies." It published many European and South American poets for the first time in this country.

In a recent assessment of Bly's work, poet, critic, and writer Kenneth Rexroth said, "Robert Bly is today one of the leaders of a poetic revival which has returned American literature to the world community. His own poems are active, and they are active on broad levels of experience. If you compare the best of them with the work of the outstanding younger members of the Old Establishment which Bly and his associates have overthrown, the most noticeable thing is that there's more to them."

"He does more, knows more, thinks more, feels more. A wide grasp of experience, an octave or more in each hand, is not just a sign of energy, it is a cause of responsibility."

Biologists Will List Field Trip Sites In Region

The Schoolcraft College biology department will host a workshop at the college on Wednesday afternoon, April 15. Biology instructors from seven southeast Michigan community colleges will begin development of an inventory of nearby areas suitable for study of an environment.

The workshop is arranged under the sponsorship of a National Science Foundation cooperative program grant in which the seven colleges are participating.

ROGER SUTHERLAND, Schoolcraft biology instructor and co-director of the COSIP program, said the biologists hope to compile data on public and private sites in southeast Michigan which are suitable for ecological study, specimen collections and educational field trips.

The data would eventually be assembled in a manual for use by members of the COSIP group, which calls itself the Association of Community College Biologists of Southeastern Michigan.

Sutherland said William Hopkins, chief naturalist for the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, and Alfred Masini of the State Department of Natural Resources, will attend the workshop to assist participants on such matters as regulations covering use of public lands and use of sites for class field studies.

According to Sutherland, ACCB will develop a uniform ecological data sheet which instructors can use on survey
