

London Printmakers Work Now In Exhibit

"Prints from London," a collection of 63 prints by four

of London's leading printmakers, are exhibited through April 12, in the Cranbrook Academy of Art Galleries, 500 Lone Pine Road, Bloomfield Hills.

The four printmakers are Richard Hamilton, R.B. Kitaj, Eduardo Paolozzi and Joe Tilson.

The exhibition organized by the Walker Art Center, Minneapolis indicates the new direction printmaking has taken.

CHRISTOPHER FINCH, the Art Center's assistant curator, says, "A predominant fact

or...has been an involvement with the anonymous imagery of popular culture—an extension of the artist's frame of reference to include a whole range of material which had previously fallen outside the scope of the fine arts."

As an example, Tilson uses vacuum-formed plastics and metalized surfaces, which indicate the interest in popular imagery has developed into a new technical aesthetic.

Paolozzi has said, "It is pointless to talk of the problem of the artist in a mass-media oriented society. If he accepts that environment, the problem vanishes and a whole new crop of benefits offer themselves."

Finch believes this sums up what is most characteristic of the best British printmaking today.

RICHARD HAMILTON, born in London, has studied at the Royal Academy Schools and at the Slade School, London. He has exhibited in England, Germany, Italy and the United States. He has designed several books and edited a typographic version of Marcel Duchamp's "Green Box."

R.B. Kitaj, who was born in Cleveland but has lived in England since 1957, studied at New York's Cooper Union and at the Ruskin School, Oxford, and the Royal College of Art, London. His one-man shows have been in England and the U.S.

The Galleries are open noon to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Friday, and 1 to 5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday, closed Mondays and major holidays.

International Festival Comes To Schoolcraft

The Schoolcraft College International Spring Festival is scheduled for Thursday, April 16.

Co-sponsored by four student organizations, the day-long festival will include a bazaar from 12 noon to 8 p.m.; an international buffet from 6 to 8 p.m.; and an international variety show from 8 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

Theme of the festival is "One World—One Humanity."

THE BAZAAR will feature booths with international handicrafts for display and sale, games, a fortune teller and many other booths.

Location of the booths will

be on the mall on the Schoolcraft campus or on the lower level of the Waterman Campus Center in the case of inclement weather. There is no admission charge.

The international buffet will be served in the Waterman Center's upper level cafeteria and will include Arabic, Creole, Chinese, German, Spanish American and soul foods.

Tickets for the buffet are priced at \$1 in the advance sale and \$1.50 at the door. If purchased before April 16 the buffet ticket will also include admission to the variety show.

AN ESTIMATED 50 performers will appear in international songs, skits and dances

during the variety show in the 175-seat Liberal Arts Theater.

On the program are: Greek dances; Latin American folk songs and dances; Arabian folk songs; North American folk songs; a Philippine folk dance and a Thai classical dance.

Variety show tickets are 50 cents at the door, but there is no charge for those obtained ahead of the festival.
