The department of home economics at Eastern Michigan University is now offering an advisory service for homemakers and others in southeastern Michigan. The service covers all aspects of family life.

Specialists in various areas are prepared to answer, without fee, inquiries by telephone or mail.

The scope of the new service is indicated by the following categories:

1. Home management, management of family resources, family financial planning.
2. Purchase and care of textiles, clothing construction, purchase and care of clothing.
3. Basic design, color schemes, texture, interior problems, redecorating in the home, lighting, display, and general design.
4. Food preparation and preservation, food purchasing, menu planning, nutritional needs of the family.
5. Restaurant management.

6. Family relationships, child development, child rearing practices, information about family-serving agencies and organizations in this area.

7. Development and evaluation of school home economics programs, and the home economics graduate program at Eastern.
