Marygrove degree major emphasizes sacred music

The Music Department of Marygrove College has instituted a new sacred music major leading to a bachelor's degree. The sacred music program will have two concentrations, choral and organ, and is being directed by Sue Ann Vanderbeck, assistant professor of music. Joining the Marygrove Music faculty is Welsh-born Huw Lewis, a concert organist of rapidly growing recognition and the music director of historic St. John's Episcopal Church in downtown Detroit.

Selected courses in the new sacred music degree program will be offered throughout the year on Marygrove's northwest Detroit campus at 8425 West McNichols at Wyoming, 862-8000, Ext. 316. A second sacred music workshop will commence in June, 1983.

The Marygrove sacred music program is designed for persons presently working in church music and those interested in the field, as well as traditional students. Specialized courses in sacred music will be offered in modules through workshops such as the 1982 Summer Workshop on Children's Choirs with renowned clinician Helen Kemp.

Modules in both the choral and organ emphasis will be available for credit toward the new degree program and for non-credit to those interested in a particular area.

The Marygrove Music Department is also developing a shorter sacred music program leading to a certification in sacred music.

In addition to standard music course work, the sacred music program features experiential training in service playing and choral directing. This will be accomplished through "on-the-job" involvement in supervised and independent church music positions. Training in organ service playing will equip students for the American Guild of Organists (AGO) certification at various levels.

A major attraction of the new sacred music program will be the teaching expertise of concert organist Huw Lewis. He was born in Wales in 1952 and received most of his formal education in Great Britain before moving to the United States to become a graduate student at the University of Michigan. He was "Organ Scholar" at Emmanuel College at Cambridge University and holds the performing and teaching diplomas of the Royal College of Music in London and the Royal Academy of Music (ARCM and LRAM).

He was awarded the Limpus Prize for highest scores upon being granted the degrees of the Royal College of Organists (ARCO and FRCO). He has also studied privately with the renowned American organist Catherine Crozier. Lewis has performed widely throughout the United States and Great Britain, including BBC broadcasts, and has received outstanding reviews. In addition to his work at St. John's church since 1974, Lewis is the music director of the Detroit Bach Society,

has taught at Wayne State University, and has served as dean of the Detroit Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.
