

# OLSM works overtime for win

Orchard Lake St. Mary's couldn't move the football in its Catholic League C-D Division encounter with Pontiac Catholic Sunday. The Eagles rushed for 100 yards, passed for none and never really threatened to score during the regulation 48 minutes.

But OLSM had what it took — a rugged defense and an accurate kicking game — to topple previously unbeaten Pontiac Catholic, 3-0, in overtime.

"It wasn't really much of an upset," said OLSM coach Al Dicken. "Pontiac was 2-0 going in, and we were 0-2, but we played better people."

Eaglet quarterback Mike Ignasiak won the game by kicking a 17-yard field goal — his first attempt this season — on the fourth play of the team's overtime series.

Pontiac had won the coin flip which begins all high school football overtime series and had chosen to go on offense 10 yards from the OLSM goal line.

The team moved to the OLSM seven after three plays, but a fourth-down clipping penalty ended the threat.

St. Mary's started from 10 yards out, moved to the six after three plays and gave Ignasiak a chance on fourth down.

The other aspect of the kicking game — punting — was a factor in St. Mary's victory. Mike Brennan boomed seven punts for a 40-yard average.

"Time and time again, he got us out of a hole with his excellent punts," Dicken said.

Another defensive standout was nose guard Sean Clouse, who was credited with 12 first hits and was in on 21 tackle series.

ties. Brennan, a halfback on the defense, made 11 tackles.

Pontiac had a couple of scoring chances during regulation play, but the OLSM defensive unit ended both of them.

Safety Jeff Petrucci intercepted a Pontiac pass on the Orchard Lake 25 to

scotch one threat, and halfback Jim Taluto recovered a Pontiac fumble after a jarring tackle by Petrucci at the St. Mary's 10 to end the other drive.

Pontiac rushed for 146 yards and passed for 70 more.

St. Mary's is home to Hamtramck St. Florian on Sunday at 2 p.m.

**SOUTH LAKE 23 CRANBROOK 17**

Cranbrook fell from the ranks of the undefeated over the weekend, and it took two overtimes before it happened.

With the teams tied at 14 after regulation time, each team scored a field goal in the first overtime. However, South Lake scored a touchdown and held the Cranes scoreless in the second extra period for the victory.

Cranbrook, which scored wins over Detroit Country Day and Cleveland University School, is now 2-1 overall.

Elijah Jones, a senior tailback who gained 65 yards in 10 carries in the game, scored the Cranes' first touchdown on a 34-yard run. Pete Long, a senior quarterback, tied the game in the fourth quarter on a 15-yard run.

Long also kicked a 22-yard field goal in the first overtime period.

Howard Brophy and Richard Haggerty both had interceptions for the Cranes, who were outperformed in total yardage, 223-145.

Cranbrook hosts Oak Park at 2 p.m. Saturday.

Troy High School graduate Jaime Jackson, along with two other Central Michigan University football players, were named players of the week following the Chippewas' 24-6 loss to East Carolina Saturday.

Punter Doug Roberts of Allendale and tackle Ron Kraft from Alpena were chosen along with Jackson.

Jackson, a 5-11, 165-pounder who was a walk-on at CMU, hauled in three passes for 49 yards against East Caro-

lina. The receptions improve Jackson's season-leading total to 10 for 208 yards.

"Jaime caught the ball when we needed it and he ran good, consistent patterns," offensive coordinator Don Feidie said. "He's a fine competitor."

Central Michigan, 1-2 overall, plays Saturday at Eastern Michigan University against the Hurons, who recently fired head coach Mike Stock and replaced him with assistant Bob Lapolite. Game time is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. at Rynearson Stadium.
