

Program to combat VD epidemic launched

United Community Services of Met-ropolitan Detroit has announced plans to launch a comprehensive metropoli-tan program to curtail the epidemic of venereal diseases.

The VD control program will be carried out by the Metropolitan VD Action Coalition, a UCS-sponsored body comprised of representatives of more than 50 agencies.

Included are health departments, community health centers, governmental units, educational institutions, family planning clinics, human-services agencies and religious, professional and youth groups.

Funds totaling \$90,000 for the programs first year of operation were contributed by the Webber Foundations; Blue Cross and Blue Shield of

Michigan; United Foundation; New De-troit, Inc.; Burroughs-Wellcome Co. as well as UCS.

In its probe of the tri-county area's VD epidemic, the coalition found that the serious effects of sexually transmissable diseases are induced mostly by ignored treatment and pub-lic misconceptions.




