City Stiffens Laws On Drugs, Loitering

FARMINGTON
The City of Farmington has adopted three new ordinances to deal with the problemes of littering near drive-in restaurants, drug abases and disorderly persons around school buildings.
The three additions, plus amendments updating the city's traffic code. were recommended by Public Safety Director Robert Deadman. He added that in the past three months, his department has confissicated five picces of equipment employed by drug users.


THE THIRD ORDINANCE carefully spells out

THE DRIVE-IN restaurant ordinance gives police authority to control conduct of persons on property adjacent to drive-in restaurants.
