Will Sell Park Bonds

FARMINGTON The State Administrative Board will sell \$36 million worth of bonds April 28, part of which will finance a park in Farmington.

Approximately \$26,000 in state funds will go to the City of Farmington for a park on Drake Rd. near Grand River.

The allocation is based on \$3.68 per person recorded in the 1960 census. The City of Farmington was one of the first to receive state approval for its plans for the use of the recreation funds.

SPECIAL ASSESSMENT STREET IMPROVEMENT KEMBERTON PARK SUBDIVISION FARMINGTON TOWNSHIP

The Oakland County Road Commission has tentatively declared its intention to make the following street improvements: Parker, Cottage, Auburn, Tulare, Avon, and Greenfield Avenues, all streets located in Kembernton Park Subdivision, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan. The plans and an estimate of cost are on file at the Oakland County Road Commission office.

The Oakland County Road Commission has tentatively designated the following special assessment district against which the cost of said improvements is to be assessed: Lots 22 through 50, 59 through 105, 130 through 163, 206 through 311, 330 through 412, and 435 through 512 (no lot 436) of Kembernton Park Subdivision, part of the 1/4 of the S.E. 1/4 of Section 26, T1N, R10E, Farmington Township, Oakland County, Michigan.
