#### Will Sell Park Bonds

Approximately \$26,000 in state funds will go to the City recreation funds.

The State Administrative Board will sell 336 million worth of bonds April 20, part of which will finance a park in Farmington.

The allocation is based on \$3,56 per person recorded in the 1990 census. The City of Farmington was one of the first to receive state approval.
