

Southfield blasts past Seaholm

Joey Walton scored 24 points and Mike McCaskill added 21 and seven rebounds Tuesday to pace Southfield's 91-61 thumping of Birmingham Seaholm in Metro Suburban Association basketball. The win put Southfield at 1-1 this season.

Vince Baldwin contributed 12 points for Southfield, and Charlie Hart snatched eight rebounds to help the Blue Jays beat Seaholm, 40-19, on the boards.

John Mullett led Seaholm with 17 points, and Brian Neffoy had 14. Southfield has a SMA showdown at Ferndale on Friday. Both squads are unbeaten in conference play. Seaholm, now 2-6 overall, plays Friday at Troy.

NORTH FARMINGTON, with John Dawson scoring 17 points, surprised Rochester Adams, 62-58, Tuesday, North is 3-4.

Ray Boyle fired in 15 points for

North, and teammate Mike Black added 14. Terry Allen led Adams with 18 points. Jeff Bullard followed with 17, and Mike Smith had 12.

North shot hot from the free throw line in the second half, making 11 of 14. North plays Friday at Westland John Glenn.

FARMINGTON HARRISON'S Gordie Dawson scored 12 points and grabbed 10 rebounds Tuesday as the Hawks

whipped Walled Lake Western, 77-52, in Western Lakes Activities Association basketball.

Dave Quiries scored 11 points for Harrison. Dave Younger had nine and John Miller provided eight and came up with five steals. Harrison, now 2-2 in the conference and 2-5 overall, raced to a 14-3 lead.

Harrison is home to Walled Lake Central Friday.

FARMINGTON FELL to Plymouth Salem, 49-24, Tuesday. The Falcons are 1-4 with the loss.

Unbeatens to clash in gymnastics

An early showdown between two of the state's most successful high-school gymnastics powers takes place tonight when North Farmington hosts rival Troy.

Both teams enter the 7 p.m. meet undefeated. North, 3-0, is coming off a double-victory over Walled Lake Western and Ann Arbor Pioneer — another state power. Troy, 2-0, is coming off an easy victory over Berkeley.

"It will be a tough meet," North Farmington coach Mary Johnesse said regarding tonight's competition. "I think Troy has a little more depth than we do, but it depends on who hits on the night we compete. I know both teams are looking forward to it."

Monday, the Raider gymnasts prepared for the Troy meet with a light victory over Pioneer in a 40-meet. North needed to score 127.85 points to better Pioneer's total of 125.15. Walled Lake Western wasn't a factor as it scored 76.7 points.

PIONEER HAD the first-place performer in each event, including three first from Ellen Stark. Stark won the vault with an 8.45, the balance beam with an 8.75, and the floor exercise with an 8.45. Colleen Furlong notched the other first with an 8.45 on the uneven parallel bars.

The Raiders finished second and third in three of the events, and second in all four. Angle Griffitt was second on the vault (8.35), second in floor (8.15) and third on the beam (8.45).

Sharon Shifra was second on the bars (8.15) and third on the vault (8.10). Teammate Kim Edwards placed third on the bars (8.15) and fourth in floor (8.05), while Dona Kehrle was second on the beam (8.55).

"I think we won it on the balance beam," Johnesse reflected. "Even though they were first in the event, we had three girls score in the 8s, and that's what really helped."

After tonight's dual meet, North Farmington, Troy, Pioneer and a host of other teams will participate in the highly-competitive Dearborn Invitational.

"That's what they (Pioneer) were saying as they were leaving. 'See you in Dearborn,'" Johnesse said.

TROY HIGH capitalized on its overall team balance Monday as the Colts easily defeated Berkeley, 118.65-80.0, in Southeastern Michigan Association action.

The Colts placed gymnasts in the first three places in all four events. Senior Kathy Michaels participated in just one event — the floor exercise — and earned a first with an 8.4.

Erin O'Rourke placed in the top three in three events. She was second in vaulting (8.05) and third on the beam (8.8), and third in floor (7.45).

Troy's first places came from four different competitors. Suzanne Enciso won the vault (8.10), Lisa Rader was first on the bars (7.4), Kim Cousino had the top score on the beam (8.05) and Michaels was first on the floor.

Enciso was second on the bars (7.2) and Michele Sirna was second on the floor (7.95) and third on the bars (7.35). Laura Sienkiewicz was third on the vault (7.65), as was Betsy Griffo on the beam (8.65).

ROCHESTER HIGH'S gymnasts earned their first win of the season just week when the Falcons posted an 84.55-74.80 victory over Lakeview.

Mindy Morley earned two first-place finishes and a pair of seconds. Morley won the beam competition with a 7.2 and also was first in floor exercise with a 7.8. Dawn Bodrie earned Rochester's other first with a 7.45 on the bars.

Morley's second-place efforts came on the vault (7.45) and on the bars (7.3). Bodrie was second on the floor (7.35) and third on the beam (8.3). Teammate Brenda Measie finished third on the bars.

Tonight, Rochester travels to Troy Athens for the Red Hawks' season opener. Saturday, the Falcons will compete in the Dearborn Invitational.

FARMINGTON HARRISON dropped to 1-2 Monday as the Hawks posted the middle score in a three-way meet with Plymouth Canton and Farmington Our Lady of Mercy.

Canton won the meet with 104.5 points, Harrison scored 93.85, and Mercy totalled 29.60.

Pam Modson had two firsts for Mercy and one second. She had first-place scores of 8.00 in the vault and floor exercise, and a second-place mark of 7.3 on the bars.

Jill Birsa was fourth for Harrison on the bars (7.1) while teammate Martha McCawhey was fourth on the beam (6.5).

Canton's Linda Beale placed first on the bars (7.5) and beam (7.0), and was second on the vault (7.85) and floor (7.8).

Harrison will be in action tonight at Clarenceville.

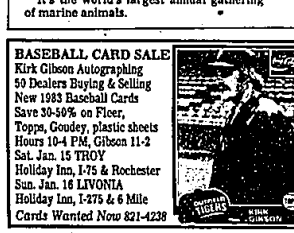
