of Surgeons in 1964. ## League to discuss primaries

On Jan. 19, the West Bloomfield-Farmington Area League of Women Voters will hold two identical general meetings which require membership consensus vote on the manner in which the presidential primary should be conducted in Michigan. In past concurrence votes, the League has supported a state-wide presidential primary funded by the state through tax revenues. The League has also supported the concept of a regional presidential primary. It supports an open primary system whereby an elector declares political party affiliation

only in the privacy of the voting booth. The League must re-evaluate these positions of supporting an open primary in Michigan and how the open primary relates to the presidential primary because the Democratic Party, on a national level, will no longer accept the results of a presidential primary held in Michigan which uses an open primary to determine election results. This stand by the Democratic Party was challenged in federal courts, yet it was upheld in the Supreme Court. On Wednesday, Jan. 19, the morning session will be held at the Orchard

United Methodist Church on Farmington Road at 9:30 a.m. The evening session will begin at 8 p.m. at the Church of Our Savior Middlebelt Road, south of Maple. Although only League members may vote in the concurrence, anyone who is interested may attend the meeting.
