# Fire destroys Jewish temple

THE LOSS provided an opportunity for Christians and Jews from other area congregations to lend a helping hand. The Jewish Community Center, area synagogues and temples and other churches offered to help hold Sabbath services, weddings and bar and bat mitzvah observances. Saturday morning Sabbath services will be at the Church of Christ Scientist, located down the street at Maple and Inkster, Rice said.

Additionally, Rice said, "The Jewish community has been absolutely wonderful. They have offered us the world."

Firefighters were still dousing hot spots about 8:30 a.m. Tuesday when Thomas Jablonski, executive director of Congregation Shaarey-Zedek in Southfield, talked his way through po-

lice roadblocks and entered the charred synagogue "to see if we could offer any support."

"Coming out of a synagogue that was still smoldering was a devastating experience," he said. "Obviously we will do whatever we're able to support a synagogue that has a problem."

"IT'S a tragedy when a synagogue is destroyed," Shaarey Zedek's Senior Rabbi Irwin Groner commiserated later that day. "Something sacred has been violated."

"It's both a house of prayer and a house of God. It's also a place where joys are celebrated, sorrows are healed and teaching is conducted. It's a kind of wound."

"We did lose our torahs and they are very dear to us," Rice said. Only torahs in the chapel were saved.

Prayer books, pictures of past syno-

gogue presidents and items donated to the synagogue in memory of loved ones were also destroyed.

The flames were reported about 12:30 a.m. by a passing motorist. Participants in a bingo game had reportedly left the synagogue an hour before. A custodian departed at 11:45 p.m., said Capt. Carl Borg of the West Bloomfield Fire Department.

Firefighters battled the blaze while contending with frigid temperatures and wind chill factor, Borg said.

Congregation President Nat Fishman, of West Bloomfield, helped with the fire hoses, as other members of the congregation gathered during the long night, Rice reported.




