Kadish Kick-Off Oakland Dems Set Horse Show

Paul Kadish of Livonia launched his campaign Sunday for the Democratic Party nomination to run for the 14th State Senate seat now held by Republican George Kuhn of Birmingham.

He told a group of about 200

persons. "This campaign will take Paul Kadish to the people and will expose George Kuhn and his voting record as anti-social, reactionary and obstructionist."

The needs and problems of the '70's call for progressive leadership at all levels of government, and we can no longer tolerate George Kuhn's 19th century policies," said Kadish.

AS VET Kadish has no opposition from within his own party. Others have until June 15 to announce candidacy. On the Republican side, Kuhn is already opposed by announced candidate Carl Pursell of Plymouth, a current Wayne County Commissioner, and engineer Al Smith. Kuhn hasn't announced his intention to run for re-election.

Kadish is a former president of the Livonia Democratic Club, is an insurance executive and has managed the campaigns of Paul Livingston 1966 candidate for the same seat, and Gary Frink, 1968 congressional candidate.

Many Livonia government leaders attended Kadish's kick-off at Morey's Golf and Country Club in Union Lake. Heading the list was newly-elected Mayor Edward McNamara, Livonia City Council President Edward Nash, Livonia's 35th District State Rep. Marvin Stepien and Livonia's venerable City Clerk Addison Bacon.

OTHERS INCLUDED 19th Congressional District Democratic Party Chairman Aldo Vagnozzi; Wayne 19th Chairman Ron Mardiros; 2nd District Chairman Robert Dwyer; Livonia Democratic Club President Ron Hecker; Farmington Democratic Club President Allen Sipher, and Oakland County's "Mister Democrat," Willis Brewer, now mayor of Sylvan Lake.

Also attending were Livonia District Judge James McCann, Oakland County Prosecutor Thomas Plunkett, Arthur Rasmussen, chairman of the White Lake Democratic Club; Douglas McLennon, Wayne 2nd District chairman; Edward Milligan, Livonia City council vice president; and Livonia Councilmen Robert E. McCann, Jerry Brown, Peter A. Ventura and Jerry Raymond.

Bill Kopanakis is Kadish's Wayne County campaign chairman and Ken Campbell is serving in that capacity for Oakland county.

Kadish hit at the slumping economy, youth drug abuse, the need for police-prosecutor-court cooperation, pollution and urban-suburban frictions and called these attending to assist in finding solutions.

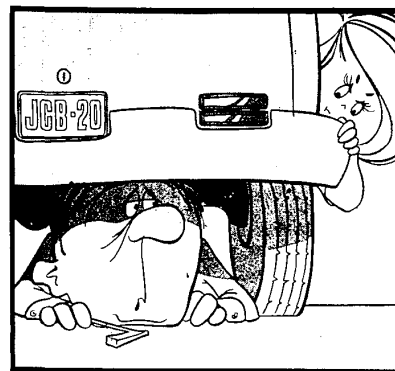
OCC Offers College Prep Reading Class

Tuition is \$18 for college district residents and \$24 for out-of-district residents.

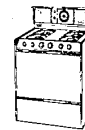
