## Township Roads Weight Limits Set

All springtime weight restrictions on Farmington Township roads have been lifted with the following exceptions:

Fox Grove from 13 Mile to Colony Circle; Mulane from 13 Mile to Bond. Weights that apply on these roads are single axle, 6,000 pounds, and tandem axle, 8,500 pounds.

Restrictions that apply on Walnut Lake Rd. from Farmington to Drake Rd. include

single axle, 11,700 pounds, tandem axle, 16,900 pounds.

Also excepted from the lifting of weight restrictions are Folsom from Farmington to Tuck Rd.; Lytle from Gill and Nine Mile to Drake; Lajon, Rhinwood, South Farmington and Connaught; and Kendallwood Subdivisions.

All other county roads in the township will revert back to standard weight allowances

## County Dems Adopt 'Rights' Resolution

PONTIAC The Oakland County Democratic Committee has adopted a resolution charging that the Nixon Administration is attempting to destroy basic constitutional guarantees of free speech, press and assembly.

The county Democratic Committee concurred in an earlier statement adopted by the Farmington Democratic Club which warned that "the Nixon Administration, led by the vice president and attorney general, has entered into a calculated and systematic attack on the voices of dissent in the land."

A second resolution adopted by the Oakland County Democratic Committee supports the expansion of minority group enrollment at the University of Michigan.

The resolution calls on Democratic legislators from Oakland County to support appropriations and other programs needed by the University of Michigan to carry out its pledge of increased minority enrollment.

The resolution noted that while "there has been traditional opposition to the concept of a quota system, we feel that a more intolerable situation is one that has kept black enrollment at the University of Michigan under the 3% level as late as the current scholastic year."

The resolution criticized Vice President Agnew for his remarks on the U-M situation and those legislators who have threatened to cut the university's funds if they try to implement the program of increasing minority enrollment.

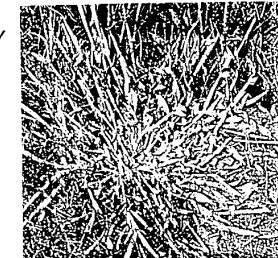
