National Music Week Festival Concert, May 3 at 3 p.m. in Farmington Senior High School auditorium, presenting the Farmington Community Concert Band, Elementary Honors Band, North Farmington Choir, Farmington High School Orchestra, and the first-place winners of the 1970 Farmington Musicale scholarships.

Power Junior High Spring Concert, May 6 at 8 p.m., directed by Justine Noetzel and Richard Cardecia.

O.E. Dunckel Junior High Band Concert, May 8 at 8 p.m., directed by Larry Detter.
