Tel-Twelve sold

Local developer buys back center

Ramco-Gershenson Inc., a Farming-ton Hills-based developer, is the new owner of the Tel-Twelve Mall in South-

owner of the Tel-Twelve Mall in South-field.

The firm recently bought the 650,000-square-foot, 60-store center from Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States and plans to reno-vate the mail, said Joel Gershenson, president of Ramco-Gershenson.

The company's decision to buy the Tel-Twelve Mall is based on the family's original involvement as developer of the shopping center and on the development's consistent, positive track record, Gershenson said.

The mail was originally developed by Aaron and William Gershenson and opened in 1988. The center was sold to

Equitable in 1978.
"We're business people," Gershenson sald in a telephone interview Monday.
"There's a sales potential for every plece of property. Equitable was the right buyer at the right time, and this major acquisition was an offer we couldn't refuse.

"WE BELIEVE the purchase at this time is most appropriate. It represents a statement of confidence by a Michigan company in the future of our state's economy. We also think Southfield is the best location in Michigan, and the market area hasn't yet peaked."

The heavy concentration of office buildings and residences in the area has brought many shoppers to the mail, Gershenson said, and he expects business to grow and attract new tenants.

The Gap and Casual Corner recently opened in space vacated by Kresge's, Gershenson said. And a number of new the control of the control of the control of the mail and other new concepts will give the center a shot-in-the arm and an exciting upilit preparing for the 1983 economic recovery. Gershenson said.

The mail is 14 years old, and a lot has happened with the state of the art in the retail business. We're planning new cellings, seating, landscaping and other amenities to create a more pleasing atmosphere for shoppers.

THE COMPANY expects to com-plete new leasing at the mall within 60 days, Gershenson said. Among new tenants are choice women's ready-to-wear stores, he said.

Tel-Twelve isn't as large as some Tel-Twelve Isn't as large as some other shopping centers, so some tenant areas will be shifted in order to max-mize space, Gershenson said. The trend in retailing is smaller stores and greater tenant mix to offer more ser-vices, he said.

Mall manager Ron Sesvold has successfully combined retail operations with educational, cultural and entertainment events, Gersbenson said, and they will continue.

The mail offers a wonderful opportunity to provide commutaty events, and we're committed to promoting that, Gershenson said.
