Just Like Pioneers

Baptist Kids Hew Cabin

The pioneering spirit is coming to the fore among the young people of the First Baptist Church of Plymouth. Like the early settlers of this western Wayne County area, they are building a log cabin.

The church's Christian Service Brigade, composed of junior and senior high students, are building the retreat cabin, located on an old logging trail

off Curtis road between Five and Six Mile Roads. JUDGE DUNBAR DAVIS of the 5th District Court is one of the adult leaders for the project.

"We're making it the old-fashioned way, by cutting down logs peeling and notching them together," said the Rev. Paul Thompson, pastor of the church located at 4500 North Territorial, Plymouth.

The logs being used are 10 to 12 inches in diameter. REV. THOMPSON said the idea came from his brother, Jim, also a Baptist minister. His church is in Iowa, and when he decided to build a cabin in the "wilderness" it drew the attention of a Chicago newspaper.

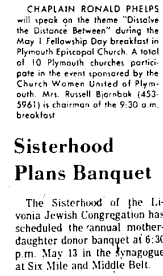
The project seemed a good one, Rev. Paul Thompson said, "because we wanted to find something constructive for the boys of our church to work on."



Greek Church Holds Rites For Easter

Dr. Demetrios Costantelos, historian, author, educator and theologian from Brookline, Mass., will conduct Easter services for the Holy Cross Greek Orthodox Church at 12 midnight Saturday, April 25. The rites will be held in the United Presbyterian Church of Southfield, 21375 W. 10 Mile, which the Holy Cross church, the newest Greek Orthodox parish in the metropolitan area, is using until it completes plans to build on Middle Belt between 10 and 11 Mile Roads, Farmington.

Resurrection observance in the Greek Orthodox church culminates a week of services including the Passions, Services of the Royal Hours and Lamentations. AT THE MIDNIGHT rites, the Easter candle is lighted at the altar and the light shared with the congregation. Then follows an outdoor procession while bells and choirs proclaim "Christ Is Risen."
