

Center's Travelogues continue with 'Tibet'

Harold and Frances Gibson will lead a program on the "Autonomous Region of Tibet" where fewer than 1,000 American tourists have explored since that area was opened to tourism in 1980. This is the third program in the winter travelogue series sponsored by Farmington Community Center at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, March 3.

"Seven Days on the Roof of the World" is a full-color slide presentation focusing on the land, people and culture of Tibet. The slides show the snow-covered mountains and isolated valleys and passes that resemble the Shangri La described in James Hilton's "Lost Horizon." The Gibsons did not find Shangri La, but they did discover a starkly beautiful country.

"People in Tibet are just as cordial and as curious about Westerners as are

the people we met in other parts of China on previous trips," Gibson said. "Their dress varies from long sheepskin coats, brightly colored aprons worn over black skirts, Mao caps and felt boots to ordinary Western dress in the cities."

On their week-long trip, the Gibsons visited Buddhist monasteries adorned with a fortune in gold, jewels and brocades. They visited a home in Lhasa, bargained for handicrafts in outdoor markets, heard monks chanting sutras before the Panchen Lama's throne and traveled across the Brahmaputra River in a yak-skin boat.

The Gibsons will give their audience a look at a different world as they saw it in October 1982. Tickets are \$2 at the door. The center is at 24705 Farmington Road.

'Delinquency' is topic for anniversary dinner

The 25th anniversary dinner of Farmington Youth Assistance will feature Dr. Ira J. Schaefer, a clinical psychologist and University of Detroit professor as guest speaker March 3.

Schaefer will speak to the audience of PYA workers, volunteers and others at the Fairmont Park Apartment Complex in Farmington Hills. His topic will be "Delinquency in Adolescents — A Clinical Perspective."

Schaefer believes that all teen-agers

with problems can't be lumped into the category of "juvenile delinquent" and treated in the same manner. They are individuals with different backgrounds whose problems need to be identified and then dealt with separately and quickly.

"The legal system is quick to label any teen-ager who does something wrong as a juvenile delinquent," Schaefer said. "The clinical perspective in looking at youths is different. Our objective

is to quickly determine what kind of background each individual comes from, and what is the best way to help each one."

Schaefer will discuss what psychologists know about the problem of delinquency and also will talk about the different types of offenders and methods to help them.

Schaefer, a Huntington Woods resident, has a bachelor of arts in clinical psy-

chology from Northwestern University and a master of arts and Ph.D. from University of Windsor. Aside from teaching psychology at University of Detroit, Schaefer has a private practice at Ridgewood Psychological Center in Royal Oak and is the associate editor of Journal of Clinical Child's Psychology.

Schaefer plans to emphasize the importance of early detection of problems so teen-agers can be helped before they get into real trouble.

Displaced Homemaker class begins March 1

The next session of the Women in Transition Displaced Homemaker short course begins at 9 a.m. Tuesday, March 1, at Oakland Community College. The course will be offered in room J 409 at the Orchard Ridge campus.

The short course provides informa-

tion on decision-making and goal-setting for those in a period of transition.

The program also offers practical ways to translate experiences and skills learned during homemaking years into a work vocabulary that is then used to build a resume.

Job interviewing techniques and career opportunities are also explored during the seminars. Guest speakers from the campus provide financial aid, curriculum, and job placement information. Speakers from the community give presentations on resume preparation, legal concerns for women and

other topics.

The small groups offer the participants the chance to pursue re-entry into the job market or to school in a supportive setting.

The cost of the six-week program is \$37. Some scholarship money is available. To register, call 471-7561.
