The statues were traced to Florida, where, under police direction, a plot was hatched to return and sell them in the Detroit area.

Last Thursday in Flat Rock, police walted for and intercepted a car, whose driver and passenger allegedly had transported the statues from Florida.

THE CAR driver and passenger, Su-san Marle Whitman, 31, and Lonnie Ar-thur Steven, 47, both of Taylor, were

arrested and arraigned on charges of receiving and concealing stolen property over the value of \$100 in Wayne County District Court.

Both stood mute and were released on \$5,000 personal bond. Examination is set for \$9 a.m. Monday in Woodhaven District Court.

"The Investigation is continuing," Madigan sald. More arrests in Oakland County are expected."

The statues are seven of a matched set of eight which were created by a Pakistanian aritst over a 20-year period, Madigan said.




