The Women, Infants and Children (WIC) program of Oakland County Health Division provides supplemental foods for low-income pregnant women, infants, and children up to 5 years of age.

Food provided by WIC includes milk, cheeses, eggs, cereals, peanut butter, peas and dried beans and infant formula.

All foods and services provided by WIC are free.

Study program in Rome and Greece is offered

St. Mary's College is sponsoring a summer study program in Italy and Greece from June 17-July 28. The program will combine the study of elementary Italian and travel.

For nine days, students will visit Greece. Points of interest on the tour will be Athens, Cape Sounion, Delphi, Corinth, Mycenae, Epidaurus, Tripoli, and Olympia.

A one-day cruise will stop at the islands of Hydra, Poros and Aegina.

Four weeks will follow in Rome for the study of Italian, including conversations with natives of the city. Language classes will be given from 9 a.m. to noon four days a week, leaving afternoons and weekends free for planned

trips to sites in Rome and cities and towns nearby.

The program is under the direction of Dr. Ralph Forestieri, assistant professor of classical languages at St. Mary's College. Forestieri spent several years studying in Italy and earned his doctoral degree from the Università Degli Studi, Perugia, Italy. He is familiar with sites in and around Rome and speaks the language fluently.

Those wishing to earn college credit may take nine credits, three in humanities and six in elementary Italian. Class size is limited to 15 persons.
