# Local Businessmen In Capital Discuss Welfare, Technology

WASHINGTON — Livonia is only the third largest business community in Wayne County, but its delegation to the national Chamber of Commerce convention in Washington, D. C. came close to being the largest in Michigan.

With 33 members, it was second only to Saginaw which fielded 38.

Neighboring Redford Township, often scoffed at as a busi-

ness community, sent four chamber representatives to help swell the more than 4,500 registered delegates and about 3,000 others taking part in various programs.

They heard Presidential advisor Patrick Moynihan pitch for the President's welfare program, much to their apparent distaste, and heard a West Coast newspaper executive dramatize the impact of the "New Generation" upon consumer goods, confirming their own suspicions.

CONVERSE DEMONSTRATED that he came to Washington to "take part." During a specially arranged dinner session with 19 District Congressman Jack McDonald (R-Farmington) Sunday night, Converse criticized continuation of any sort of federal welfare. He said, "We don't challenge people and give no reward for challenge."

McDonald said in defense of his support for the President's welfare program. "It's the first time there's been a definite requirement for people to work..." He noted the program requires welfare recipients to take job training and any reasonable job offer.

Robert Fitzpatrick, Wayne County commissioner, from Detroit, an executive of Suburban Industrial Clinic in Livonia, argued that "welfare is a federal program and should be financed by federal funds."

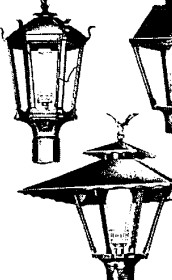
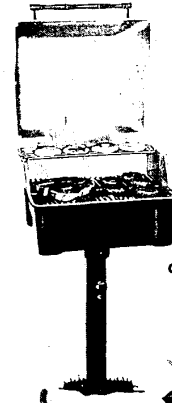
