Russ Wright of Detroit, also known as Chief Littlewing in the Cherokee tribe, will be at the festival with the American

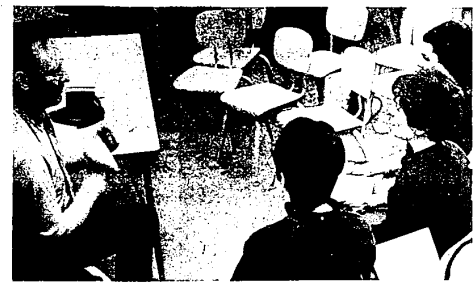
Indian dancers from 10 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

The group as now constituted is planning to present a program for the Livonia Jewish Congregation women on May 12 and will also sing for the Plymouth Senior Citizens May 28.

Some of its members also will be attending the Sweet Adelines regional convention in Grand Rapids May 9 and 10.

"WE WOULD LIKE to apply for chapter status this spring so we can rehearse this summer and sing in the Plymouth Fall Festival," said Mrs. Alice Fitzpatrick of Northville.

"We need just a few more regular members," she added. "All that's required is the ability to sing in tune and an en-

joyment of singing. We aren't looking for solo voices.

Director of the group is Marvin Skupski, who belongs to a Wayne Barber Shop Quar-

ter. Rehearsals are held in room 114 at Plymouth High.
