

THE MAJOR discovery involved a collection of volumes by 18th-century poet William Blake.
Twenty volumes of a 23-volume Blake collection turned up missing during inventory, investigators said.
"We had a difficult time substantiating any of the Blake books at all," Gilroy said.

Though the time frame remains sketchy, investigators have been able to trace one of the less-expensive volumes back to last October. At least ten volumes were known to be in place in the collection at times during the past three years, according to investigators. Investigators are continuing their study of a theft at Harward University in Cambridge, Mass.

"I wouldn't necessarily say there was a link, but there is a similarity in that (catalog) cards were taken there, too," Gilroy said.

THEY HAVE, however, virtually ruled out any connection between the OU theft and a cache of books uncovered earlier this year in a St. Louis suburb.
