

Christian Scientists share in hosting annual meeting discussions

Christian Science churches around the world have the opportunity this June to share the denomination's annual meeting season through a unique collaboration.

Instead of local Christian Scientists traveling to Boston for the June meeting of The Mother Church, the First Church of Christ, Scientist, a special videotaped discussion will be traveling to them. First Church of Christ, Scientist, Farmington, has scheduled its meeting for 8 p.m. Monday, June 6, in the church auditorium, on Grand River, west of Farmington Road.

The hour-long commentary was prepared earlier this year at the denomination's international headquarters. It focuses on the church's widening efforts to meet the challenges of what it judges to be intensely materialistic times through revitalized commitment to spiritual values and Bible precepts.

Harvey W. Wood, 1983-84 chairman of the Christian Science board of direc-

tors, said he finds "an encouraging and growing commitment on the part of Christian Scientists to let their lives more than their words be the proof of what Christian Science is."

The Boston meeting, as the 104-year old denomination's church manual prescribes, consists of reports from church officers, committees, and branch churches in some of the 56 countries where the denomination is represented.

James Spencer of Birmingham will begin a three-year term as First Reader for worship services of The Mother Church in Boston. Spencer is a lifelong Christian Scientist who has been active in the public healing ministry of his church since 1954, and since 1976, a teacher of Christian Science. He recently completed 16 years as a member of the Christian Science Board of Lectureship. He was president of The Mother Church in 1977.

Band takes bronze medal
