Two cheerleading workshops will be offered at Eastern Michigan University this summer in cooperation with the International Cheerleading Foundation. The first session is scheduled for July 5 through 10 and the second July 12 through 17.

Every phase of cheerleading, pep and spirit course, including uniform designing, will be taught in regular college classes. Squads will be graded on their improvement in all

aspects of cheerleading and leadership.

Any high school or junior high cheerleader or prospective cheerleader may attend. However, enrollment is limited to 200 students.

The \$55 fee covers residence hall accommodation including meals which are available cafeteria style, tuition and recreation.

Local Men Help Plan Satellite

Three Observerland engineering students at the University of Michigan are among a group proposing a \$33 million air traffic control satellite over the crowded North Atlantic corridor.

They are: Tom Case of Plymouth, Kurt Dembeck of Farmington and George Marek of Southfield.

They've presented a feasibility study for their team's proposal, dubbed SCANNAR, and incorporating a 521-pound orbiting communication satellite.

"Air traffic control problems are not limited to the United States. The North Atlantic is rapidly approaching the time when close air traffic control will be necessary," said the U-M students.

SCANNAR would also provide a direct communication link between the ground station and any aircraft.

The system would have two solar panels, a communications antenna and four interferometric antennas. Electrical power would be by solar cells and, when the satellite is in the earth's shadow, by batteries. It would have a minimum span of two years.

Kuhn Hails Spending Cuts By State

State Sen. George W. Kuhn (R-Bloomfield), is pleased with G.O.P. senators and Governor William Milliken who agreed to sharp cutbacks in the governor's budget.

Kuhn started a campaign for reduced government spending last December when he sent Milliken a letter, supported by 16 other Republican senators, urging a "hold-the-line" budget for 1970-71.

Kuhn stressed then, and continues to stress, "The economic outlook is still in a downward trend, and we cannot afford an increase in state spending at such a time."

"The budget areas to be hit the hardest would be new state construction projects, higher education and welfare," said Kuhn.

Since the Kuhn letter of last December, "the governor's budget experts have agreed to cut between \$100-\$110 million off the originally proposed budget. Further, the governor has agreed to strongly oppose any increase in the state income tax," Kuhn said.

Country Day Sets Carnival

The architectural firm of Ralls, Hamill and Becker was approved by the Livonia Board of Education to begin developing plans for a fifth senior high school.

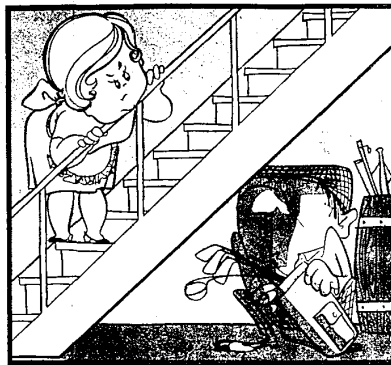
Payment was made contingent on a passage of a bond issue to finance the school construction.

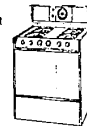
The course instructed Bell management people in capital expenditure decision making.
