## Festival Draws 10 Residents

Local residents will be among the thousands of colorfully kilted Scots from throughout the United States and Canada who are expected to attend the Alma Highland Festival Saturday, May 23.

A total of 10 local residents will compete in the Scottish Piping and Scottish Dancing contests.

Last year 30,000 persons lined the main street of Alma to watch the 36-unit festival parade. Ten thousand jammed into Alma College's Bahlke Stadium to see a massed band performance by 500 pipers and drummers besides day-long competition in Highland dancing, piping, drumming and caber tossing plus a battle of pipe bands for the U.S. Open Pipe Band Championship.

This year the events begin at 9 a.m. with pipers, drummers and Highland dancers in line.

Rob Roy and Jacques Guernsey are co-directors of the local production of "The American Dame" by Philip C. Lewis. The Comedy traces the history of the female in a series of skits starting with the time of Adam and Eve and ending with the present day.

**THE FESTIVAL PARADE**, with approximately 100 floats, bands and other marching units, will begin at noon on the east side of the Alma business district and move westward along the main street of the city to the college campus.

Immediately following the parade, at about 1:30 p.m., a massed band of 500 pipers and drummers from all the festival's competing pipe bands will join in a performance in Bahlke Stadium.

This ceremony is followed by competition for the U.S. Open Pipe Band Championship.

Highland dancers will continue their competition throughout Saturday afternoon.

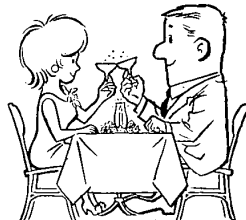
